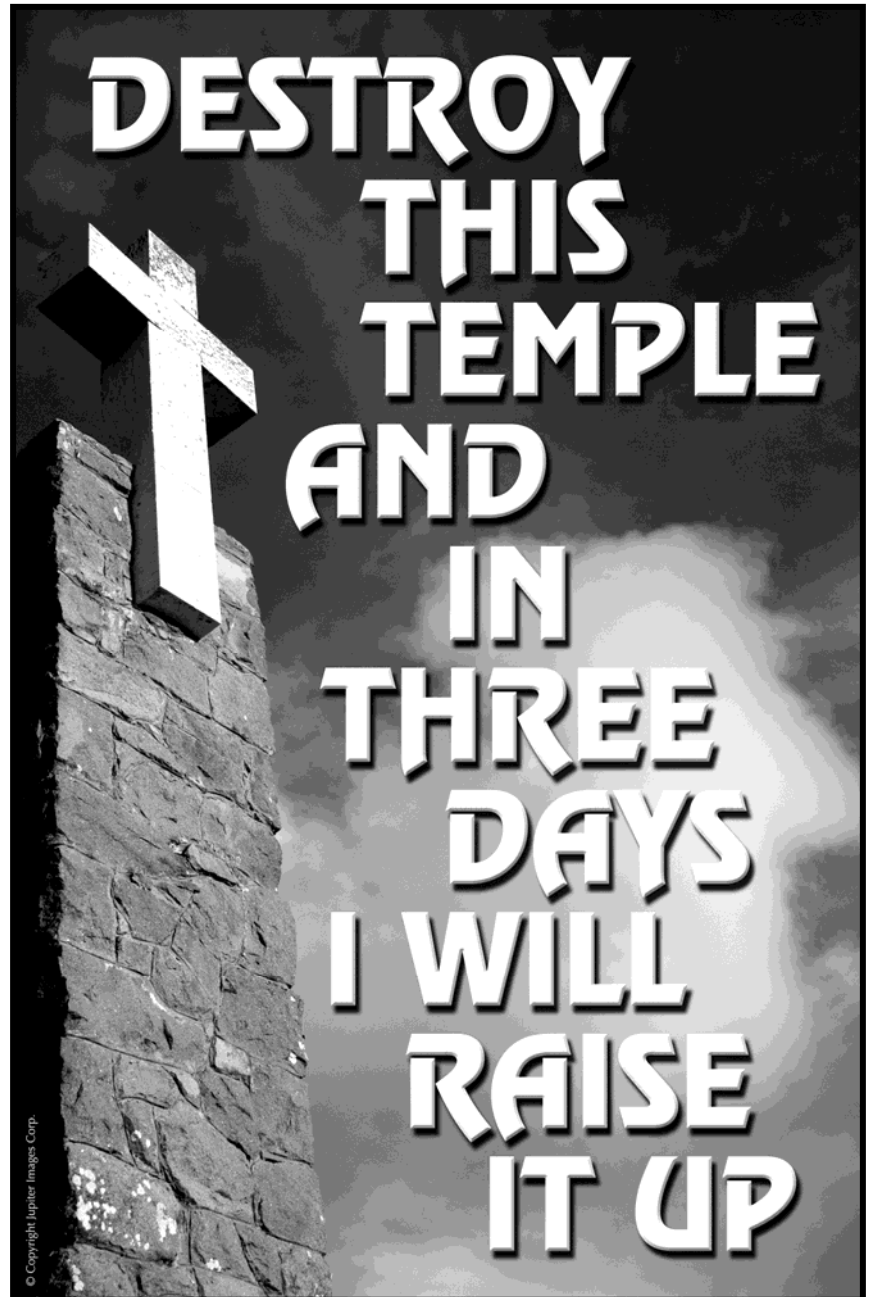

Third Sunday of Lent
March 4, 2018

Volume 217

I, the LORD, am your God . . .
You shall not have other gods
besides me.

-- Exodus 20:2a, 3

In today's readings, Jesus expels the moneychangers from the Temple by overturning their tables, and then he overturns their idea of worship by proclaiming himself as the new temple.

"Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up," he said, and you can understand why his listeners, standing inside the Jewish temple, were confused.

This passage is in chapter 2 of John's gospel, very early in Jesus' public ministry. John wants to show us that all of Jesus' public actions are signs leading up to his Paschal mystery, that is, his suffering, death and resurrection. Thus the puzzle that Jesus presented to the moneychangers was a test to see if they were more interested in money or in God. In this season of Lent we test ourselves the same way; we sacrifice something (Alcohol, video games, certain foods) to see if God is more important to us than our attachments.

And yet Jesus' message is more than a test. He wants to show us that when we give of ourselves in sacrifice, we tap into the power of his own Paschal mystery that leads to the freedom of new life.

The prayer group asked me to give a talk this month during their Thursday evening prayer titled "The Cross, Fountain of Grace." They want me to cover three points: 1. Without the cross, there is no redemption, 2. How to accept our own reality, no matter how painful, and 3. Learning to walk with Jesus accepting the cross.

1. Without the cross, there is no redemption. In the 4th century, St. Athanasius wrote, "What has not been assumed has not been saved." What he meant is that Jesus Christ assumed our human nature completely when he lived among us, and that means he assumed even our human death. And when he did so, he showed us that his Father's love is more powerful than death, for it was a love that raised him from the dead. This power redeems our lives, even when at our last moment we may think that our days on earth have amounted to nothing. If we have followed Jesus' way, our lives have value in God's eyes, our lives are worthy of heaven. If Jesus had not experienced the humiliation of the cross as a criminal, we might think that our crimes are more powerful than his mercy. But they are not.

2. How to accept our own reality, no matter how painful. By the same reasoning, there is no pain of ours that Jesus does not experience. He understands our deepest griefs; John 11:35 reports that "Jesus wept" at Lazarus' death. He underwent humiliation by wearing a crown of thorns. He experienced the torture of being whipped and he carried his own means of execution, the cross, up the hill to his death. So when we experience our deepest pains, we can be assured that he knows, that he can compassionate with us.

Which leads us to 3. **Learning to walk with Jesus accepting the cross.** When we realize that it is Jesus who first walked with his cross, and that he is the one already walking with us, we can better accept our own cross. Some of our crosses are indeed hard to bear, like the loss of a loved one, or the constant care for those who cannot respond to us, or a condition that prevents us from doing the work we used to be able to do. But realizing that Jesus accompanies us can help us better bear our difficulties. What's more, when we experience how Jesus' suffering gives us the power of his resurrection, we can in turn accompany others with their crosses.

So let the power of Jesus' Paschal mystery which we celebrate during Lent and Holy Week empower us to the new life God desires all of us to experience.

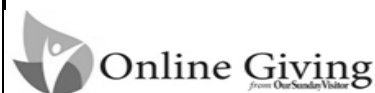

Yo soy el Señor, tu Dios . . .
No tendrás otros dioses fuera
de mí.

-- Exodo 20:2a, 3

En las lecturas de hoy, Jesús expulsa a los cambistas del Templo volcando sus mesas, y luego volcó su idea de adoración al proclamarse a sí mismo como el nuevo templo. "Destruye este templo y en tres días lo levantaré", dijo, y puedes entender por qué sus oyentes, que estaban dentro del templo judío, estaban confundidos. Este pasaje está en el capítulo 2 del evangelio de Juan, muy temprano en el ministerio público de Jesús. Juan quiere mostrarnos que todas las acciones públicas de Jesús son señales que conducen a su misterio pascual, es decir, su sufrimiento, muerte y resurrección. Por lo tanto, el enigma que Jesús presentó a los cambistas fue una prueba para ver si estaban más interesados en el dinero o en Dios. En esta temporada de Cuaresma, nos probamos de la misma manera; sacrificamos algo (alcohol, videojuegos, ciertos alimentos) para ver si Dios es más importante para nosotros que nuestras ataduras. Y, sin embargo, el mensaje de Jesús es más que una prueba. Él quiere mostrarnos que cuando nos damos en sacrificio, aprovechamos el poder de su propio misterio pascual que conduce a la libertad de una nueva vida. El grupo de oración me pidió que diera una charla este mes durante su oración de la tarde del jueves titulada "La Cruz, Fuente de Gracia". Quieren que cubra tres puntos: 1. Sin la cruz, no hay redención, 2. Cómo aceptar nuestra propia realidad, sin importar cuán dolorosa sea, y 3. Aprender a caminar con Jesús aceptando la cruz.

1. Sin la cruz, no hay redención. En el siglo IV, San Atanasio escribió: "Lo que no se ha asumido no se ha salvado". Lo que quiso decir es que Jesucristo asumió completamente nuestra naturaleza humana cuando vivió entre nosotros, y eso significa que asumió incluso nuestra muerte humana. Y cuando lo hizo, nos mostró que el amor de su Padre es más poderoso que la muerte, porque fue un amor que lo resucitó de entre los muertos. Este poder redime nuestras vidas, incluso cuando en nuestro último momento podamos pensar que nuestros días en la tierra no han sido nada. Si hemos seguido el camino de Jesús, nuestras vidas tienen valor a los ojos de Dios, nuestras vidas son dignas del cielo. Si Jesús no hubiera experimentado la humillación de la cruz como un criminal, podríamos pensar que nuestros crímenes son más poderosos que su misericordia. Pero no lo son.

2. Cómo aceptar nuestra propia realidad, sin importar cuán dolorosa sea. Por el mismo razonamiento, no hay dolor nuestro que Jesús no experimentó. Él entiende nuestras penas más profundas; Juan 11:35 informa que "Jesús lloró" en la muerte de Lázaro. Sufrió humillación de llevar una corona de espinas. Experimentó la tortura de ser azotado y llevó su propio medio de ejecución, la cruz, colina arriba hasta su muerte. Entonces, cuando experimentamos nuestros dolores más profundos, podemos estar seguros de que él sabe que puede compadecerse de nosotros.

Lo cual nos lleva a **3. Aprender a caminar con Jesús aceptando la cruz.** Cuando nos damos cuenta de que es Jesús el primero que caminó con su cruz, y que él es quien ya camina con nosotros, podemos aceptar mejor nuestra propia cruz. Algunas de nuestras cruces son realmente difíciles de soportar, como la pérdida de un ser querido, o la atención constante para aquellos que no pueden responder a nosotros, o una condición que nos impide hacer el trabajo que solíamos hacer. Pero darse cuenta de que Jesús nos acompaña puede ayudarnos a sobrellevar mejor nuestras dificultades.

Lo que es más, cuando experimentamos cómo el sufrimiento de Jesús nos da el poder de su resurrección, podemos a su vez acompañar a otros con sus cruces.

Así que permita que el poder del misterio Pascal de Jesús que celebramos durante la Cuaresma y la Semana Santa nos capacite para la nueva vida que Dios desea que todos experimentemos.
